PREFACE

The report covers the period, July 21, 2013 - July 20, 2014. This marks the fifty fifth year of the Department, and its forty fifth year as a Centre of Advanced Study in Sociology.

The Department of Sociology was established by the University of Delhi in 1959 as a constituent of the Delhi School of Economics. To begin with, the Department trained students for two courses: M.A. and Ph.D. In 1966, a two-year course for the M. Litt. degree was introduced. This has been replaced since 1976 by an M. Phil. degree course of a year's duration. In 1968, the Department was recognized as a Centre of Advanced Study in Sociology by the University Grants Commission (UGC). At present, the sanctioned strength of the faculty includes six Professors, eight Readers, seven Lecturers, and three Research Associates. In addition, there eight members on the office staff.

The Department has a co-coordinated programme of teaching and research covering a variety of fields, including some developed for the first time in the country. Studies have been published or prepared on community power structures, local-level politics, trade unions, co-operatives, textual and contextual studies of Hinduism, religious symbolism, family and kinship, and social and religious movements. Studies have also been conducted in the fields of stratification, gender, environment, the sociology of development, historical sociology, urban sociology, the sociology of collective violence and medical sociology. The sociology of masculinity, demography, popular and visual cultures, education, migration, the sociology of violence and documentary practices of the state are some of the new areas that faculty members are working on at present.

The Department has been visited by a large number of distinguished scholars from India and abroad, who have delivered lectures and given seminars, some of them as Visiting Professors and Fellows. The faculty of the Department has also been associated with many institutions in India and elsewhere as Visiting Professors and Fellows, and as participants in seminars and conferences. The Department draws students from different parts of India and from universities abroad for all its courses.

All members of the faculty are actively engaged in research, which has resulted in the publication of a long list of books, reports, and research papers in different fields of sociology. The Department has undertaken several research projects during the last five decades. Members of the Department have been actively associated with the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR) and the UGC in preparing surveys of research and teaching in the discipline.

From its very inception, the Department has encouraged a view of learning in which students are given an opportunity to participate actively in discussions. To supplement the classroom interaction between teacher and M.A. students through lectures, the Department has an active M.A. tutorial programme. In this system, each student is assigned a tutor who discusses particular topics and allocates reading and writing exercises in accordance with the needs of a student. Thus a student has a continuous feedback on his or her progress. Small groups of students meet their tutor every week for discussion and each student writes one long essay per course every semester. Since 1994-95 a system of continuous internal evaluation has been introduced, where the marks of one tutorial essay submitted in each course are counted towards the final examination. The Department follows the semester mode for both teaching and examination for several years now.

He was awarded the Padma Bhushan by the President of India in 2005.

WORKSHOPS AND CONFERENCES ORGANIZED BY THE DEPARTMENT

Four workshops were held in the Department during 2013-14

Affirmative Action in USA and India, was held on 30 August, 2013. This workshop was organized by the Department of Sociology in collaboration with the Centre for South Asia, Stanford University. It was an afternoon event in which senior undergraduates from Stanford and MA and M.Phil. students from the Department of Sociology made presentations on the history, current performance and emerging challenges of affirmative action and reservations respectively. A concluding discussion session was led by Prof. Thomas Blom Hansen of Stanford Centre for South Asia and Prof. Satish Deshpande of the Department of Sociology.

In/equality and mobility in India was held on 7-8 November, 2013. It was co-organised and cofunded by the Department of Sociology, Delhi University and the Centre for Global South Asian Studies, University of Copenhagen. The participants included Nandini Gooptu (Oxford), Carol Upadhya and Aparna Sundar (Bangalore), Vamsi Vakulabharanam (Hyderabad), Surinder Jodhka, D. Shyam Babu, Divya Vaid and Kaustav Banerjee (Delhi), Ravinder Kaur and Emilija Zabiliute (Copenhagen). The conference focused on the drivers of mobility (state action, market, technology, education, migration); regional differences in patterns of inequality and rates of mobility, sectoral differences in mobility, as well as the stickiness of caste and gender. It also looked at the way in which hierarchy is reproduced in new avenues of mobility, and the different kinds of mobility (social, spatial, income). Questions such as what was different about the post reform period and continuities and changes in the concept and practice of inequality were also discussed.

Punjab Today was held on 6-7 February, 2014. The outlines of the seminar 'Punjab Today' emerged from the research level course 'For a Sociology of Punjab' offered as part of the M.Phil Program of the Department of Sociology. The seminar brought together sociologists, historians, political scientists, scholars of literature, film and theatre. Papers addressed a wide range of issues including those of gender, internal and transnational migrations, borders and exchanges, caste and peasant questions, bodies and performances. An exhibition Dastaari [the feminine turban] of photographs with text, organized by the M.A. students, was displayed as part of the seminar. The seminar was partially funded by the ICSSR. The concept note and abstracts of the papers presented are available on the website of the Department of Sociology.

Imaginings of Climate Change was held on 6-7 March, 2014. Climate change is now a hot global topic. While it was largely perceived as invisible, inchoate, not localizable and future-oriented, a careful study of climate change shows up a growing body of societal and cultural imaginings/adaptations that relate to this phenomenon. The workshop sought to capture the subject in its diverse manifestations and provide glimpses of a social field as it reflects on impacts upon the human species and beyond.

The workshop was convened by Dr Rita Brara and twelve papers were presented over two days. The Workshop sought to document and reflect on imaginings and social representations of climate change that are evident in popular cultural productions. The presentation made evident the visualizations of climate change that are apparent in the form of cartoons, students' drawings and textbook illustration, 'Climate fiction' and in how photographers frame climate change through their portrayals.

Research Scholars' Workshops

Two Research Scholars' Workshops were held during the academic session 2013-14

Workshop 1: November 16, 2013

A one day Research Scholars Workshop for MPhil and PhD students was held on the 16th of November, 2013. A bi-annual event organised by the Department of Sociology, the workshop encourages scholars from the department to share their ongoing research work with both faculty and peer group. The eight participants spoke on key aspects of their research which included reflection on theoretical, methodological and ethnographic concerns. The faculty-discussants offered critical feedback to the participants, besides

keeping themselves abreast with research work supervised by their colleagues. Comments, suggestions and criticisms from all quarters were well received by all the participants thereby honing their research acumen.

Workshop 2: March 27-28

A two day Research Scholars Workshop for MPhil and PhD students was held on March 27-28. There was enthusiastic participation of both M.Phil and Ph.D. students in the workshop. There were four panels with paper presentations which had been organized by the students. The Panel titles were: 'Aspirations and anxieties in a world class city: New Delhi'; 'Interspecies: Entanglements of the human and non-human'; 'Art, technique and/or labour' and 'Space, place and politics'. There was also a round table discussion on 'Ethno/Graphy and methodology: Thinking with/about documents'. The Workshop concluded with reports of the conveners and comments from faculty members about the strengths and weaknesses of the workshop.

Public Lecture

A Public Lecture was delivered by Professor Maurice Bloch of the Department of Anthropology, London School of Economics, UK on 25th February, 2014. Professor Maurice Bloch was a Visiting Fellow at the Department at that time. The topic of the lecture was: 'How 'religion' came about?' and it was very well attended. Dr. Deepak Mehta was the discussant and the lecture also provoked a thoughtful question-answer session.




