THE KABULIS IN DELHI CITY:

GENDER AND CULTURAL PRACTICES OF AFGHAN SIKH REFUGEES

Abstract:

This is an ethnographic account of Afghan refugees in West Delhi. In this part of Delhi most of the Afghan refugees are Sikhs. Even after almost three decades of settlement of Afghan Sikh refugees in India, their cultural practices, migration strategies, and socio-economic hierarchies have remained unexplored. The presentation focuses on these aspects of the community to explain how their family settings, marriage and kinship practices, educational and occupational ambitions have found spaces in the fabric of Delhi city.

The Speaker:

Dr. Shelly Pandey is currently Guest Faculty in the Department of Sociology at the University of Delhi. Earlier, she was in the Gender Studies and Sociology faculty at the Ambedkar University, Delhi. Her research interests include interdisciplinary approaches to study gender; urban spaces; globalization; migration; information and communication technology (ICT); and work. In 2012 she was the recipient of the M.N. Srinivas Memorial Prize awarded by the Indian Sociological Society. Her Ph.D. is from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT) Delhi on Gendered Experiences of Globalized Work World in India. Her post-doctoral research from Teen Murti was on Afghan Sikh refugees.
